



## AMENDMENT REPORT FOR MAY 21, 2025

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The following table provides an initial summary of amendments filed in the Illinois House and Senate on May 21, 2025, **which may have implications for county governments**. These amendments touch on public safety, taxation, infrastructure governance, pension training requirements, and housing policies. ISACo will take positions on these amendments if necessary and update our tracked bill service to reflect adopted amendments.

Bill (Amendment)	Summary	Potential County Impact
HB 2545 (SCA 1)	Expands the State Housing Appeals Board's authority to hear appeals not only from developers but also housing organizations, service providers, and prospective residents challenging municipal denials of supportive housing projects.	This amendment could reduce county and municipal autonomy in zoning decisions for supportive housing, potentially increasing the number of appeals counties must address and requiring adjustments to local review processes.
HB 3493 (SFA 1)	Exempts municipalities over 500,000 in population from new rules if they have existing agreements with the Capital Development Board. Still requires the Board to compensate local governments for fair and reasonable impact costs.	Reaffirms compensation rights for counties involved in state infrastructure projects, helping to offset costs related to connection, restoration, or other local impacts.
SB 1855 (SCA 1)	Requires units of local government that reduce or eliminate law enforcement services to reimburse other law enforcement agencies providing those services. The reimbursed amount is based on a cost-analysis study.	Significantly affects counties by ensuring they can seek reimbursement when stepping in to provide law enforcement services for municipalities that scale back their own police forces. It may also prompt intergovernmental cooperation or disputes.
