



AMENDMENT REPORT FOR MAY 22, 2025

The following table provides an initial summary of amendments filed in the Illinois House and Senate on May 22, 2025, **which may have implications for county governments**. These amendments touch on public safety, taxation, infrastructure governance, pension training requirements, and housing policies. ISACo will take positions on these amendments if necessary and update our tracked bill service to reflect adopted amendments.

| Bill (Amendment) | Summary | Potential County Impact |

| SB 1989 (HFA 1) | This amendment significantly revises the Kaskaskia Regional Port District Act, expanding the District to include Canteen, Centerville, East St. Louis, Stites, and Sugar Loaf Townships in St. Clair County. It transfers the Southwest Regional Port District's powers, operations, assets, and responsibilities to the Kaskaskia District, effective by December 1, 2025. The amendment alters board membership composition (9 from St. Clair County, 3 each from Randolph and Monroe Counties) and repeals the Southwest Regional Port District Act as of January 1, 2026. | By expanding the Kaskaskia Regional Port District to include five additional townships in St. Clair County, the amendment increases that county's influence over regional port operations through a restructured board in which nine of the fifteen members must reside in St. Clair County. This change enhances the county's role in decision-making and regional economic development planning. The transfer of duties, assets, and responsibilities from the Southwest Regional Port District to the Kaskaskia Regional Port District will require coordination among affected counties, especially regarding existing intergovernmental agreements, infrastructure oversight, and service delivery. Counties may also be involved in managing the transition process and adapting to the revised governance and operational framework established by the amendment. |
