Bipartisan Infrastructure Law



 Provides the Department of Transportation \$660 billion over five years between FY 2022 through FY 2026.



- NHTSA Funding
 - BIL will provide an increase of \$7.7 billion over the next 5-years.
 - Increases by \$517 million in FY 2022, 53% more than the FY 2021 enacted level

Grants (1 of 2)



State Grants

- Authorizes \$3.9 Billion in Sections 402, 405 and 1906 formula grant funding to States over FYs 2022-2026.
- Transforms the Highway Safety Plan into a more strategic 3-year plan that includes meaningful participation of affected communities, identification of disparities in traffic enforcement

Grants (2 of 2)



- National Priority Safety Programs State Formula Grants
 - 6 continuing grants (Occupant Protection, Traffic Information Systems, Impaired Driving, Distracted Driving, Motorcyclist Safety, and Nonmotorized Safety)
 - 2 New Grants: Roadside Death Prevention and Driver and Officer Traffic Stop Education (beginning in FY2024)
- Modifications to Grant Program [1906 Racial Profiling] State Formula Grants
 - Promote grant program and technical assistance to States
- Department of Motor Vehicle Recall Grants State Discretionary Grants
 - Focuses on increasing recall completion
- Driver Alcohol Detection System for Safety Discretionary
 - Safety Research and Development

Behavioral Safety



Safe System Approach

- Test and implement strategies to improve safety culture for education campaign
- Enhanced Child Passenger Safety
 - Emphasis to increase CPS use in underserved communities
- Traffic Safety Equity
 - Provide technical assistance to States and Improve Data collection
- Pedestrian Safety
 - Implement Pedestrian Safety Action Plan
 - Establish Performance Metrics
- Driver Alcohol Detection System for Safety
 - Safety Research and Development
- First Responder Safety
 - Coordinate with State and local agencies

Rulemakings

- At least 12 additional vehicle safety rulemaking mandates
- Underride Protection for Semi-Trailers
- Adaptive Driving Beam Headlamps
- Advanced Impaired Driving Technology
- New Car Assessment Program (NCAP)
 - Request For Comment

Supplemental Appropriations for Vehicle Safety Research

- Expanded research on emerging lightand heavy-vehicle ADAS technologies to support policy and NCAP roadmap decisions
- Advanced frontal and side impact female crash dummies

Crash Data



Crash Data

- Provides an additional \$750 million over 5 years to expand reporting of roadway crash data through new State Electronic Data Transfer grants and enhancements to NHTSA's Crash Investigation Sampling System
 - Increase participation in Electronic Data Transfer (EDT) protocol via new State grant program and internal investment
 - Expand Crash Investigation Sampling System (CISS) by adding sites, broadening scope, and adopting onscene investigation protocols
 - Collect additional data elements related to all crashes and better data on pedestrians, bicyclist and motorcyclists
