- Starved Rock State Park in LaSalle County is hosting a Native American history program on Oct. 8, and on Oct. 21 the park will host a guided fall colors hike, ghost stories, and children's programs about bats and animals around the world.

The <u>Illinois Public Hunting Areas Report</u> is developed each year to provide information on public hunting/ trapping efforts and wildlife harvest. This report provides both hunting and trapping information on IDNR owned, leased, or managed public hunting sites.



2023-2024 deer archery hunting season opens Oct. 1

Deer archery hunting season opens Oct. 1, in Cook, DuPage and Lake counties, and a portion of Kane County east of State Rt. 47: Oct. 1-Jan. 14. In all other counties and that portion of Kane County west of State Rt. 47: Oct. 1-Jan. 14. EXCEPTION: Archery deer hunting is CLOSED during firearm seasons Nov. 17-19 and Nov. 30-Dec. 3.



Deer firearm and muzzleloader hunting information

County-specific firearm and muzzleloader permits remaining after the third lottery drawing will be available for sale only over the counter at <u>license vendors</u> beginning Oct. 17, on a first-come, first-served basis.



2023-2024 fall turkey archery season opens Oct. 1

The <u>fall turkey archery season</u> opens Oct. 1 for Cook, DuPage and Lake counties, and that portion of Kane County east of State Route 47: Oct. 1-Jan. 14. For all other counties and that portion of Kane County west of State Route 47: Oct. 1-Jan. 14. NOTE: fall turkey archery hunting is CLOSED during deer firearm seasons Nov. 17-19 and Nov. 30-Dec. 3.













Apply for 2024 spring turkey hunting permit

<u>Illinois resident hunters</u> may apply for one spring turkey hunting permit in the first lottery. Applications are being accepted Oct. 3-Dec. 1. 2023



2023 fall turkey shotgun season Oct. 21-29

Permits will be <u>sold until quotas are exhausted</u>, or until the close of the season, Oct. 29. Persons may purchase one or more permits during this period, subject to availability, except that no one may exceed the limit of two permits in total, including lottery-issued and landowner permits.



Youth deer firearm season Oct 7-9

Youth deer firearm season is Oct. 7-9. Hunters may only purchase one youth deer permit which are available for purchase over the counter at license vendors until Oct. 9. The Youth Deer Season is only open to hunters who have not reached their 18th birthday prior to the opening date of the season.

Illinois EPA Grants Provisional Variance at Request of Prairie Path Water Company

The Illinois EPA has granted in part a provisional variance to Prairie Path Water Company (Northern Hills) from the five-day Carbonaceous Biochemical Oxygen Demand (CBOD5) and Total Suspended Solids (TSS) effluent limits in the facility's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit (NPDES Permit). The provisional variance will allow various repairs to components, including the package plant treatment system and clarifier, of the Northern Hills Sewage Treatment Plant (STP), extend the life of the STP, and improve its operations. The Illinois EPA has denied Northern Hills' request for a provisional variance from the Ammonia Nitrogen (Ammonia) effluent limit set forth in the NPDES Permit.during a lottery and mailed to successful applicants.



Lincoln's New Salem State Historic Site candlelight walk

Lincoln's New Salem State Historic Site candlelight walk is Oct. 6 and 7, 7 p.m. - 9 p.m. The Candlelight Walk offers the only opportunity to see the village at night. Period clothed interpreters will be inside many of the log homes and shops in the village to talk about life in 19th century Illinois.

Lewis and Clark State Historic Site 4th annual craft fair

Local artisans will make their finely crafted goods available for purchase at the 4th Annual Historic Craft Fair on Oct. 21 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Goods ranging from baskets to shawls to pottery and more will be available. Do some early holiday shopping. Or get something wellmade for yourself.



Nature and culture hike at Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site Oct. 14

There is a nature and culture hike from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. on Oct. 14 at <u>Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site</u> with Julie Zimmermann, PhD. Learn about native plants and animals and how the Mississippian culture interacted with them and the environment. This two-hour hike will travel along some of the less commonly traveled trails, so make sure to wear appropriate clothing, sturdy shoes suitable for hiking, and to bring water. Sunscreen, bug spray, and snacks are advised, make sure any refuse is properly disposed of at the Interpretive Center.



Pere Marquette State Park hosts a fishing and night owl program Nov. 3

Pere Marquette State Park's fishing and night owl program is Nov. 3. The educational fishing program begins at 5:30 p.m. for any kids who would like to come fish at the Blue Gill Pond next to the Visitor Center. At 7:30 p.m. begins the program on owls and other creatures that might be heard or seen outdoors while camping or hiking. Following the program, the night hike will start. This hike is around two miles and a portion of it will be uphill. When the hike is over join us for a hotdog and marshmallow roast. Refreshments and drinks are provided but we ask that each family brings one flashlight. We also advise that everyone wears hiking shoes. There is no fee for this event or need to register.



Vandalia Statehouse State Historic Site Grande Levee celebration Oct. 14

A Grande Levee celebration featuring food, activities, and musical entertainment will take place on Oct. 14, at the Vandalia Statehouse State Historic Site, Illinois' oldest state capitol building. From 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 14, visitors can enjoy demonstrations, the selling of wares, ham & beans by Crown Point Church, folk music by Chris Vallillo, Randy Duncan who portrays Abraham Lincoln, will appear in the House of Representatives chamber, Charles Lyons will present Times in History, a traveling museum, Fayette County Art Connection will have three members painting, children's area with fun period games and Animal Tales will present creepy critters. The Grand Levee is a celebration of the grand receptions that took place during the 1800s to honor government dignitaries and important visitors when Vandalia was the seat of Illinois state government. The event is free and open to the public.

The event will feature exhibitors of vintage tools, firearms, 18th Century medicine, military re-enactors, and artillery.
